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### Newsletter 7 – Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> January 2024

There are so many exciting events and experiences coming up for the children over the next few weeks, including Year 5 and 6's residential trip to Kilvrough, Year 2's trip to the Living Rainforest and De La Pole class's participation in the Oxfordshire Dance Festival at the New Theatre. These events follow the poet visit in school today and Year 3 and 4's trip to the Ashmolean Museum last week.

In this newsletter you'll find out more about these events and what else is coming up between now and Easter.

It has also been positive and very useful to be visited recently by our School Improvement Partner and the Education Safeguarding Advisory Team (ESAT), both of whom spent time speaking with myself, staff and the children and scrutinising our paperwork and plans. The school improvement partner commended our strong key stage 1 and key stage 2 assessment results at the end of last year and the good start we have made to address the areas for development identified by the Ofsted inspection in March. The ESAT advisor meanwhile found that our safeguarding arrangements remain robust and effective and suggested some helpful next steps to strengthen this important area further.



### New learning topics for the spring term

Since coming back to school following the Christmas holidays, the children have started working on new topics of learning.

Chaucer (Reception and Year 1) are learning about the seasons of the year and how these affect the natural world around them.

Year 2 are learning about the rainforest and will be rounding off this topic with a trip to the Living Rainforest next week. They will then move on to a new history-focused topic on the Great Fire of London.

Year 3-4 are learning about Ancient Egypt and were inspired further by their trip to the Ashmolean last Friday.

Year 5 and 6 have started a new topic on Earth and Space, learning about the science of our solar system, the history of astronomical theory and discovery and using the universe beyond our planet as a stimulus for lots of fantastic creative writing.

In the summer term, the children will move on to the next set of topics: Chaucer – 'In the Country'; Roet – Explorers and Inventors Burghersh – 'Our Village'; De La Pole – 'Off with their Heads –


British monarchs through time'

### Year 3-4 trip to the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford

Last Friday, Burghersh class (Year 3 and 4) visited the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford as part of their new topic on 'Ancient Egypt'. They visited the Ancient Egyptian gallery, getting a closer look at genuine Egyptian mummies, their sarcophaguses and tombs and a range of other Ancient Egyptian artefacts.

Museum staff were especially excited to hear that the children had come from Ewelme School and showed the class angel statues



taken from Ewelme Church that are on display in the museum's England gallery.



The class also visited the Quaker Meeting Hall nearby where they had lunch and participated in a Quaker 'mini-meeting'. Miss Lea, and staff from the Ashmolean Museum, observed how engaged and well behaved the children were throughout the trip. Well done Burghersh!

### **Oxfordshire Schools' Dance Festival:**

De La Pole class (Year 5 and 6) are participating in the Oxfordshire Dance Festival at New Theatre, Oxford on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> February.

# Chaucer exhibition at Weston Library, Oxford



The school is very proud of its history, having been founded in 1437 by Alyce Chaucer, granddaughter of Geoffrey Chaucer and former resident of the now demolished Ewelme Palace. The school is said to be the oldest in the country that still operates in its original buildings! Next year is the 550<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Alyce's death and the school plan to participate in events to mark this landmark and celebrate her contribution to the local area.

Weston Library, part of the Bodleian Library in Oxford, are currently hosting a Chaucer exhibit that may be of interest to parents and some of the older children. It features a number of interesting artefacts, including a Chaucer family-tree on which the children could find the four class names – Chaucer, Roet, Burghersh and De La Pole. ### Kilvrough residential trip:

Children and staff are busy making last-minute preparations for next week's residential trip to Kilvrough Manor Outdoor Education Centre in South Wales. The Year 5 and 6 children will be experiencing a whole variety of challenges including climbing, caving, water sports and lots of team-building and problem-solving activities.



Remember, children attending the trip need to *arrive at school on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> February between 7.10 and 7.20am* to allow time to register them and collect in medication etc. Please come to the Breakfast and After-School Club entrance (the large wooden doors on the right hand side at the bottom of the steps leading up to the school office). The coach will be leaving at 7.35am.

This means the coach should have departed before the start of Breakfast Club at 7.45am but, if you need to drop off for breakfast club on this day please be mindful that the outside of school may be much busier than normal at this time.

On Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February, it is expected that the coach will arrive back at school by 7pm. This is obviously dependent on traffic. You will be kept up to date about our expected arrival time via email by the school office.
