Spotlight on Dance

On Wednesday 21st February, the children went to the village hall for our annual 'Spotlight on Dance' event when they have a chance, in their classes, to perform to the rest of the school and show-off the routine they've worked on in PE lessons during term 3 with Mrs Seymour.

This year saw Chaucer class perform a dance based on the theme of Chinese New Year, Roet perform a rainforest-tribe inspired routine and Burghersh share their Ancient Egyptian dance. De La Pole meanwhile performed their routine from the Oxfordshire Dance Festival (see below for more details).

De La Pole class (Year 5 and 6) participated in the Oxfordshire Dance Festival at New Theatre, Oxford on Tuesday 20th February.

Like last year, the children practised tirelessly in school with Mrs Seymour and Mr Codd to perfect their routine and then performed this on stage in front of approximately 1,700 parents/carers, invited guests and children from other schools.



Their dance, to the song 'Fat Sam's Grand Slam' from the film 'Bugsy Malone', went brilliantly and we were all very impressed with their resilience and composure despite understandable nerves beforehand. Well done to everyone involved!



Year 2 trip to the Living Rainforest





On Wednesday 7th February, Year 2 went to the Living Rainforest near Newbury as part of their rainforest topic.

The children had a great time, learning more about the rainforest biome and how animals have adapted to it and having a chance to see real-life rainforest plants and animals up close.

Year 5 and 6 had a highly successful residential trip to Kilvrough Manor in South Wales the week before half-term. Despite some inclement weather, the children had a great time and experienced a wide range of different activities including canoeing, rock climbing, abseiling into the sea, waterfall walks, coastal exploration, orienteering, a 'night-walk', problem solving and team building activities. Unfortunately the heavy rain meant the river level was too high for caving, although I think a few of the children (and a couple of adults) were secretly quite pleased about this!

They also adapted brilliantly to the routines and responsibilities of staying away from home, working in 'duty teams' to set up, serve and tidy away after breakfast and lunch, preparing their dormitories each morning for a 'room inspection' and collecting and organising the clothing and equipment they'd need for each day's activities.

Next year we will be off to Woodlands Outdoor Education Centre again for our three-day trip before returning to Kilvrough for a full week in February 2026.


