Update regarding Ewelme Pre-School



On Wednesday 1st May, Ewelme Pre-School held an extraordinary general meeting to discuss and vote on the proposal to dissolve the pre-school charity and merge with the school as of September 2024, or as soon as possible thereafter.

Lyndsey Knight, as chair of the pre-school's committee, and myself, explained our reasons for proposing a merger between the pre-school and the primary school and answered questions from those in attendance. Jayde, pre-school manager, spoke briefly on behalf of herself and the staff team to explain the benefits from their perspective and to confirm that the staff team were supportive of the plan.

The two resolutions, firstly to dissolve the pre-school charity and transfer assets to the school, and secondly to approve a merger with the school, were both agreed unanimously by those in attendance.

We are keen to hear your thoughts and opinions on this proposal and will therefore be sending further information to parents/carers very soon as well as providing a platform for you to share questions and comments.
