### **Collective worship at Ewelme:**

Collective worship is an essential element of helping us to fulfil our vision for our school, based on the bible passage below and our mission to enable all members of the school community to 'be all that you can be'.

"Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything." James 1:4

This vision, and our school's values of being ready, respectful, responsible, resilient and reflective, are expressed, deepened, developed and celebrated though our collective worship.

Collective worship should enable all members of the school community to develop spiritually through the invitation that is offered to all to share together in prayer, singing, reflection, stillness, silence, calm, joy, laughter and collective worship in all its forms.

Collective worship is contributed to by teachers, pupils, invited visitors, the head teacher and the local clergy; led by the head teacher; and overseen by governors.

#### At Ewelme, our aim is to have daily acts of collective worship which are:

- Calm and reflective
- Opportunities to celebrate and strengthen our school's Christian ethos and vision
- Opportunities to introduce, discuss and reinforce the school's values of being ready, respectful, responsible, resilient and reflective

#### Consistent features of all collective worship:

- Music as the children arrive to create a calm and reflective environment
- A candle is lit at the start
- The school prayer is recited collectively (and other prayers may be shared)
- All invited to participate periods of reflection
- The candle is extinguished at the end
- Uplifting/upbeat music played as the children leave

#### In addition, in our weekly assembly in church, we:

- Share a bible reading, read by a Y6, and selected by Rev. Marion
- Recite the Lord's Prayer collectively (as well as the school prayer)
- Say a blessing

## Link with St. Mary's Church, Ewelme:

We attend St Mary's Church, Ewelme every week for collective worship. This assembly is led by a member of the clergy.

In addition, we attend the church on four other occasions throughout the year:

- Harvest Festival All parents/carers and extended family invited. Donations of food and other
  items are made by families and passed on to Wallingford Food Bank, run by the Ridgeway Church.
  Classes prepare poems, prayers and/or presentations linked to harvest and/or theme of gratitude
  and thanksgiving.
- Christingle service All parents/carers and extended family invited. All children make traditional Christingles for use in the service. Classes each prepare short performances linked to theme previous examples have included Christmas around the world, the nativity story and music linked to Christmas.
- The Easter Experience All parents/carers and extended family invited. Each class prepare a short performance or presentation linked to the different parts of the Easter story Palm Sunday, the Last Supper, the Garden of Gethsemane, the crucifixion and resurrection.
- Year 6 leavers' service Year 6 parents/carers invited and given priority seating. Other parents/carers invited. Led by Year 6 including a short performance and presentation of traditional leaving gifts.

All the celebrations and services above include opportunities for singing – whole-school, classes, school choir, duets and solos – and prayer.

# Spaces for reflection and spirituality in our school grounds and local area

Spaces have also been created in and around the school grounds for pupils to pray, reflect and/or contemplate:

- Our Forest School site regular opportunities are offered for the children to be still and calm in the outdoor environment, focusing on what they can hear, feel or smell. They are often encouraged to look especially closely at small details in the natural world around them or to pay attention to things they would normally ignore or disregard. Time is often take to discuss or marvel at the small wonders of the world around the children during Forest School that isn't always otherwise available in the busy day-to-day life of the school.
- Peace Garden the old school house garden has been extensively redeveloped in conjunction with Friends of Ewelme School. It has been planted to offer a range of smells, colours and textures and raised vegetable beds have been installed to be planted up and maintained by the children.
